Tender & Selection

- * Advertising and publicizing your vacancy in Ghana on our various social media channels, our website, and at conferences and job fairs.
- ★ Selection of the 6 best candidates through interviews in our office.
- ★ 1-day candidate assessment: Ready to live and work in Germany?
- ★ Shortlist of the 3 best candidates and first virtual meetings/interviews with you.



Preparation in Ghana

- ★ German course at the Goethe Institute in Accra, optionally up to level B1.
- ★ 1-week course "Living and Working in Germany", prepared and conducted by our Ghanaian staff with very good knowledge of German (working) culture.
- ★ Family/parent visit to the candidate to anchor the decision to live and work in Germany in the candidate's family.
- ★ Interim evaluation with you after 2 months: "Go or No": You make the final decision!
- Virtual introductory meeting with you and your future colleague, prepared and moderated by us.



Departure

- ★ Visa advice and assistance in compiling all necessary documents.
- ★ Applying for a visa appointment and preparing the candidate for the interview.
- ★ Packing suitcases for Germany.
- * After arrival: Integration mentoring by the Senior Expert Service (SES).

ARRIVING WELL IN GERMANY

A key component of the successful integration of young people from Ghana is the support provided by mentors from the Senior Expert Service (SES). This is especially true during the first few months in their new place of residence and work.

SES mentors see themselves as welcome guides. They provide assistance in all situations with practical tips and valuable contacts – crucial support for navigating what is initially a completely unfamiliar environment.

SES's offerings are based on the organization's many years of experience with coaching programs, from which several thousand trainees benefit every year.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING IN GHANA

Vocational training in Ghana is only partially comparable to the dual training system in Germany in terms of content and scope. Much of the knowledge is acquired in the informal sector; however, there are also a number of public and private training institutes that focus on specific professions (electrical engineering, plumbing, hotel management, air conditioning, automotive maintenance, etc.) and provide solid expertise that can serve as a good foundation for further training in Germany.

The Delegation of German Industry and Commerce in Ghana is currently collaborating with several training institutions from which suitable candidates can be recruited for German companies. The experience has been very positive:
